

## 1 Harbor View Trail

.8 miles of paved roadway and pathway

Scenic views through Lakeside Park and Marina. Meander through shaded areas. Terrific for recreational walking or jogging.

## 2 Brooke Street Trail

2.9 miles of paved pathway and roadway

This former rail bed is a wide flat stretch of pathway though Fond du Lac's industrial district. The southern portion travels along Hickory Street and Dixie Street using bike lanes and sharrows (shared lanes with vehicular traffic).

## 3 Riverwalk Trail

1.8 miles paved pathway

Scenic trail following the Fond du Lac River and through downtown. A perfect spot for a recreational walk, with a variety of businesses to stop at along the way.

## 4 Pioneer Trail

2 miles of paved pathway and roadway

The western portion of the Pioneer Road Trail is a paved pathway which parallels the main road. Designated bike lanes run from Main Street to Park Avenue. Park Avenue is an on-street portion of the trail in a quiet residential neighborhood.

## 5 Prairie Trail

5.8 miles paved pathway from Martin Road to Peebles Trail

6.7 miles paved pathway from Martin Road to Winnebago Drive

Open prairie views along Highway 151. Several benches along the path to stop and take a break.

## 6 Peebles Trail

2.1 miles of compacted gravel pathway

A former rail bed in a heavily wooded area. Very popular for recreational walkers and joggers.

## 7 Winnebago Trail

3.1 miles paved roadway

On-street bicycle lanes travel along Winnebago Drive with views of Lake Winnebago.

### P Public Parking

There are many areas along the Loop for private parking. Public parking lots are indicated on the map. There is also ample parking on Brooke Street, Park Avenue and throughout Lakeside Park.



### Public Restrooms

Public restroom facilities are located in Lakeside Park and Buttermilk Park.



### Busy Intersections

Extra caution should be used at all intersections. It is recommended that bicyclists walk their bicycle through any busy intersection as designated on the map.

The southwest portion of the Loop connects to the Wild Goose State Trail. This trail is a 34-mile trail extending from Fond du Lac to Juneau. A former railroad corridor, it is now a heavily wooded recreational trail with a surface of crushed gravel.
